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The following **FREE** services and resources have been developed with a grant from the Illinois State Board of Education that is funded 100% through IDEA Discretionary Federal Funds.

- **Online Professional Development** - Over 40 modules with video or PowerPoint on a variety of topics related to behavior and students who are deaf, hard of hearing, or visually impaired. New modules are added every year. Teachers and social workers can earn FREE Professional Development hours.
- **Lending Library** - Materials are mailed out with return postage included. Books, DVDs, games, toys, and other items are related to behavior, social emotional learning, parenting, deafness, visual impairment, sign language, Braille, Autism Spectrum Disorder, AD/HD, and more. www.isrc.us/library
- **Classroom Support** - ISRC Behavior Coaches provide onsite visits for support with student behavior, including data collection coaching, home-school communication, and FBA/BIP development.
- **Parent Support** - ISRC Behavior Coaches provide home visits to support families in utilizing behavior support strategies consistent with those used at school. ISRC has also developed a behavior support curriculum for parents.
- **Individual Education Plans** – Support from ISRC can be identified in the Notes Section as a source of technical assistance, training, and personnel development.
- **School and District Improvement Plans** – Support from ISRC can be identified as a source of continuous improvement via technical assistance, training, and personnel development.
