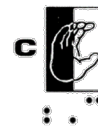

Deaf Culture (Elementary)

Who Was Helen Keller, Thompson (3 copies)

A biography of the woman who, with the assistance of her devoted teacher Annie Sullivan, achieved success and fame despite being blind and deaf.

Deaf Culture Fairy Tales (3 copies)

Readers are transported into the enchanting world of fairy tales in this book -- with one slight twist: all the stories have characters who are deaf or sign.

Some Kids are Deaf, Schaefer (3 copies)

Teach diversity and tolerance to young readers, and help them understand and appreciate those children who have health differences.

The Smart Princess, Carey (3 copies)

A collection of short stories, *The Smart Princess* takes readers inside the fantasies, dreams and disappointments of young people who are deaf.

The William Hoy Story, Churnin (3 copies)

William "Dummy" Hoy became one of the greatest and most beloved players of his time, in spite of his deafness! This picture book tells his story.

Deaf Culture (Middle Grades)

Deaf Child Crossing, Matlin (3 copies)
